

New Mexico Youth Beef Feeder Contest

HEY YOU, there is a new kind of beef contest available!!!

- · Focus on learning about the New Mexico Beef industry
- Focus on skills and information that directly translates to a future in beef production
- Experience producing a beef steer through a commercial feedlot
- Work with New Mexico beef producers and provide information on how their calves perform in the feedlot and on the rail
- Leadership opportunities
- · Scholarships awarded!
- · And MUCH MORE!!!!

This program has been designed by the Youth Feeder Contest Committee and sponsored by the New Mexico Beef Council to provide a contest for youth interested in the business aspect of raising beef from start to finish. The contest will have two phases.

Phase I involves backgrounding New Mexico weaned spring-born calves. Participants will purchase and validate their calf by October 30, with a requirement of a 500 pound minimum weight. Participants will feed out their calves until March. Phase I also includes a leadership opportunity. Participants will give a speech during Ag Fest on the beef industry.

Phase II requires the calf to be fed in the Tucumcari feedlot. Participants can track their individual calf's performance from home using the Growsafe technology. Calves are required to weigh a minimum of 800 pounds upon entry into the feedlot. The calves will be in the feedlot from March to September, and then they will be transferred to the USDA inspected facility in Las Vegas, NM. Carcass data will be collected as part of the scoring for awards and returned to participating producers.



2022 Citizenship Washington Focus—Registration due by October 15, 2021 for the 2022 CWF Focus

Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF) is a leadership program for high school youth from across the country. Every summer, thousands of young people participate in this week long program. CWF provides opportunities for you to broaden appreciation and practice respect for themselves and others, increase individual commitment to citizen involvement and understand the importance of civic and social responsibilities as they relate to the development of better citizens and leaders.

Time is provided for 4-H members to report accomplishments in 4-H to our representatives in the Washington, D.C. area as well as participate in sightseeing trips. Contact Steve or Nicole if you are interested. Registration due to the State 4-H Office by October 15, 2021.

4-H Home Economics Lettermen

Any 4-H Member who is active in Home Economics Projects may "letter" in Home Economics. All that is necessary to "letter" is to complete the requirements in their age level and submit the appropriate forms to their County Extension Office by September 1. The first year a member letters they receive a "clover" letter as you would see on a lettermen jacket. Bronze, Silver, and Gold pins in the shape of the letter "H" are awarded in the respective age levels. A member can "letter" at any time, even if they did not begin as a novice, but they will receive the pin for the appropriate age level.

In addition, two platinum letters will be awarded each year in the form of a plaque. The platinum letters are based on overall achievement and may be received at any age level. Platinum awards are selected from all applications submitted in that 4-H program year. 


